1. TRADITIONAL TERRITORIAL ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

6.1 Policy Items

S. Dench spoke to the proposed changes to the College/School District Relationship Policy.

- a) College/School District Relationship Policy changes include:
 - revised policy name: Secondary Dual Credit & Concurrent Studies Policy
 - removal of outdated content: the ACE IT program is no longer in place
 - removal of conflicting policy: registration priority is determined under other College policies.

Discussion ensued regarding the concurrent studies language which allows for students to begin earning credits while still in Grade 12 (or in their final year). C. Cragg will connect with S. Dench and S. Schechter after checking with her FACS coordinators who have existing school district partnerships to ensure existing partnerships will not be disrupted.

6.2 Budget Newsletter 2022/23

The Chair referred to the 2022/23 Budget Newsletter and Council's mandate to formulate budget advice to the College Board. No written feedback was submitted from Faculty Education Committees.

Several faculty representatives on Education Council expressed their view that student accommodation requests have increased significantly and have created additional workload for teaching faculty. They also stated that they had received some feedback that more funding for accessibility services would be desirable. Discussion ensued.

It was noted for Council that the 2022/23 Budget proposes the hiring of one additional Adaptive Technology Coordinator who will be in place early and trained this semester for support during the final exam period. It was also noted that new provincial Accessibility legislation will shift focus to universal designs for learning.



The Chair will summarize the feedback received by the Education Council and forward this advice to the Senior Management Team (SMT) and the College Board.
