### Forensic Psychology (15 credits- 12 credits from Crim with a min 6 UL credits)

It is recommended to take and 1000-2000 level CRIM pre-requisites in your first 2 years. If not, two of them can be taken as part of your concentration. If lower-level credits are taken as part of your concentration then additional upper-level credits must be taken within the 15 LL or UL University Transferable section.

### Required:

Psychology and Law (PSYC 3314)

#### **Electives:**

 Any four (4) UT courses from Criminology, with at least 6 credits at the 3000-4000 level.

#### Leadership and Management (15 credits)

A Leadership and Management Concentration requires a minimum of 15 UT credits from Commerce and Business Administration or Social Sciences, with a minimum of 6 credits at the upper-level (3000-4000) in Commerce and Business Administration..
