B. Younan, Registrar reminded the initiator of the additional edits recommended at the November 2024 meeting:

B. Younan suggested two additional edits and recommended that (1) credits not be rounded when calculating the 50% (32.00-34.00 credits) and (2) remove the reference to a note from MUSC 1276.

The President inquired about the increased number of credits and asked if there was a way to reduce the number of credits closer to 60. The initiator confirmed that the number of credits were not changed, however, she will take this information back to the music faculty for clarification.

The President emphasized the need for diploma programs to fit into two years and would like this conversation raised more broadly amongst constituency groups.

We do not anticipate encountering any issues similar to those faced by other institutions, as their challenges run deeper. The College has not been experiencing financial difficulties, resulting in a lower impact on our operations, prompting us to adjust our strategy to ensure it is more amenable.
