Honours Application Guidelines 2025

Due to increased applications and limited seats for the Honours BA Applied Psychology program we have created some guidelines to help us rank applicants who all, otherwise, meet the minimum entrance requirements (minimum program GPA = 3.33; minimum credit hours completed = 75). The following outline some of our criteria. We request that you speak to these criteria (below #1 – #5) in a statement of intent 500 words or less. You should also attach a current resume but be sure to point out in your letter the specific aspects we are looking for.

New this year, we would also like you to submit a writing/critical thinking sample that summarizes and integrates the state of research in an area of interest to you. You should use a minimum of 3 academic research articles and at the end propose a testable research question that could be generated from this research area. This does NOT need to be the research question or research area that you hope to address in our Honours thesis, but it could be. This writing sample must be written by you without the help of AI or Faculty members.

Maximum 2 pages single spaced. Please also include references and citations in APA style. The reference page is not included in the 2 page max.

Ranking criteria topics to note in your letter

- 1. GPA note in your letter your current program GPA
- 2. Credits completed minimum 75. Please note in your letter how many credits you have already completed (not in progress) and comment on how quickly you plan to complete your degree (i.e. how many courses you tend to take a semester, or the date of your planned last semester).
- **3. Key courses completed** we will look at your past grades in courses related to research and data analysis including (but not limited to): PSYC 2300, 2301, 3300, 3301, CRIM 3325. For each of these courses that you have completed please note your grade in your letter.
- **4. Intended Graduate Program(s)** please note which graduate program or programs you intend to apply to. Be as specific as you can (i.e. SFU Clinical Psychology PhD or UBC Counselling Psychology MA etc.).
- 5. Extra-Curricular Activities/Volunteer work: Please note if you have any extracurricular activities, (volunteer or paid) that would make an application to a graduate program more appealing. Examples could include but are not limited to: volunteering or paid work experience in a helping related field (if you intend to apply to a counselling, clinical or social work graduate program), research or research lab experience, Psychology Society participation, research days presentations, other school/program or community involvement, or certifications or awards of importance.
